The Bonnies had earlier defeated Alliance College 3-1 as seniors Mike Sutter and Pete Bonanno and juniors Ron Fodge each scored. Goalie Pete Kelly played a brilliant game and helped to preserve the win.

The Bonnies fell at RIT last Wednesday, 5-2, in a game played on a combination rain and snow-slicked field. Bonas completely dominated the first half and led 2-0, on goals by Mark Westerholt and Fodge. RIT did manage to score one before the half ended.

The area near the goal mouth became very muddy and manuverability was difficult for goalie Kelly. As a result RIT pushed four goals across to win the contest.

Fodge's play earned him an All-American

The goalie blocked it, then blocked Westerholt down on the rebound. A penalty kick was ordered and Fodge rammed it through for the deciding goal with one minute to go.


The Bonnies scored first as Tom Liguori ran for a five-yard touchdown with 1:44 left in the first quarter to cap a 50-yard drive.

Undefeated Siena displayed an excellent ground attack, scoring 14 points in the second quarter. The Bonnies offense had an excellent chance to score in the last minute of the half, but four attempts from the Siena seven-yard-line proved fruitless.

Siena lengthened its lead, scoring twice in the third quarter. The Bonnies ended the scoring midway in the final quarter as quarterback Tim Bergen hit end John Morello with a 45-yard bomb.

Coach Conte said the turning point of the game occurred in the first quarter when the Bonnies were called for unnecessary roughness. The penalty allowed Siena to keep the ball when the Bonnies should have had it on the punt. Siena took advantage of the break and put together a long drive for a touchdown.

The Bonnies close out the inaugural season tomorrow at 2 p.m. against Rochester Institute of Technology (RIT). Coach Conte describes tomorrow's game as "even-steven." RIT was defeated by Niagara, 48-14, while the Bonnies also bowed, 44-13. A tough-running club, RIT, basically runs from an unbalanced line with a modified T formation.
